The Lord said to his disciples, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and in him God is glorified. If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself, and glorify him at once. Little children, yet a little while I am with you. You will seek me; and as I said to the Jews, so now I say to you 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Simon Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, where are you going?" Jesus answered him, "Where I am going you cannot follow me now, but you shall follow me afterward." Peter said to him, "Lord, why cannot I follow you now? I will lay down my life for your sake." Jesus answered, "Will you lay down your life for my sake? Truly, truly, I say to you, the cock will not crow, till you have denied me three times."

## John 14:1-31

Let not your hearts be troubled; believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And when I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself; that where I am, you may be also. And where I am going you know, and the way you know." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father but by me. If you had known me, you would have known my Father also; henceforth, you know him and have seen him."

Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we shall be satisfied." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and yet you do not know me, Philip? He who has seen me has seen the Father; so how can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father, and the Father in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority; but the Father who dwells in me does the works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father in me, or else believe me for the sake of the works themselves.

"Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in me shall also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do because I go to my Father. Whatever you ask in my name, I will do it, that the Father may be glorified in the Son; If you ask anything in my name, I will do it.

If you love me, keep my commandments. And I will pray to the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever; the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive because it neither sees him nor knows him; you know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you.

I will not leave you desolate; I will come to you. Yet a little while longer and the world will see me no more, but you will see me. Because I live, you will live also. In that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. He who has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me. And he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him." Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, "Lord, how is it that you will manifest yourself to us, and not to the world?" Jesus answered him, "If a man loves me, he will keep my word; and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. He who does not love me does not keep my words; and the word which you hear is not mine but

the Father's who sent me.

These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. You heard me say to you, 'I go away and I will come to you.' If you loved me, you would have rejoiced because I go to the Father, for my Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it takes place, so that when it does takes place, you may believe. I will no longer talk much with you, for the ruler of this world is coming. He has no power over me. But I do as the Father has commanded me so that the world may know that I love the Father. Arise, let us go hence.

#### John 15:1-27

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-dresser. Every branch of mine that bears no fruit, he takes away; and every branch that bears fruit, he prunes that it may bear more fruit. You are already clean by the word which I have spoken to you. Abide in me and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in me and I in him, he it is who bears much fruit: for apart from me you can do nothing. If a man does not abide in me, he is cast out as a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered and thrown into the fire and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you will, and it shall be done for you. By this my Father is glorified: that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should abide; so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. This I command you, to love one another.

If the world hates you, you know that it hated me before it hated you. If you were of the world, the world would love its own. But because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. Remember the world that I said to you, 'A servant is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you. If they kept my word, they will keep yours also. But all this they will do to you for my name's sake because they do not know him who sent me. If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not have sin, but now they have no excuse for their sin. He who hates me hates my Father also. If I had not done among them the works which no one else did, they would not have sin; but now they have seen and hated both me and my Father. It is to fulfil the word that is written in their law, 'They hated me without a cause.' But when the Counselor comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness to me. And you also are witnesses because you have been with me from the beginning.

John 16:1-33

I have said all this to you to keep you from falling away. They will put you out of the synagogues; indeed, the hour is coming when whoever kills you will think he is offering service to God. And they will do this because they have not known the Father nor me. But I have said these things to you, that when their hour comes, you may remember that I told you of them.

I did not say these things to you from the beginning because I was with you. But now I am going to him who sent me, yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. Nevertheless I tell you the truth. It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Counselor will not come to you; but if I go away, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin, and righteousness, and judgment: concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father and you will see me no more; concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

I have yet many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak; and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. Therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

A little while, and you will see me no more; again a little while, and you will see me because I go to the Father." Some of his disciples said to one another: "What is this that he says to us, 'A little while, and you will not see me; and again a little while, and you will see me'; and, 'because I go to the Father'?" They said, "What does he mean by 'A little while'? We do not know what he means." Jesus knew that they wanted to ask him, so he said to them, "Is this what you are asking yourselves: what I mean by saying, 'A little while, and you will not see me; and again a little while, and you will see me'? Truly, truly, I say to you, you will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice; you will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy. When a woman is in travail, she has sorrow because her hour has come; but when she is delivered of the child, she no longer remembers her anguish, for joy that a child is born into the world. So you have sorrow now; but I will see you again and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you. In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you, if you ask anything of the Father, he will give it to you in my name. Hitherto, you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full.

I have spoken to you in figures; the hour is coming when I shall no longer speak to you in figures, but tell you plainly of the Father. In that day you will ask in my name, and I do not say to you that I shall pray to the Father for you; for the Father himself loves you because you have loved me and have believed that I came from God. I came from the Father and have come into the world. Again, I am leaving the world and going to the Father."

His disciples said, "Ah, now you are speaking plainly, and not in any figure! Now we know that you know all things and need no one to question you. By this we believe that you came from God." Jesus answered them, "Do you now believe? The hour is coming, indeed, it has come, when you will be scattered, every man to his own, and will leave me alone; yet I am not alone, for the Father is with me. I have said this to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."

## John 17:1-26

When Jesus had spoke these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify

thee, since thou hast given him power over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom thou hast given him. And this is eternal life, that they may know thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent. I glorified thee on the earth, having accomplished the work which thou hast given me to do. And now, Father, glorify me together with thyself, with the glory which I had with thee before the world was.

I have manifested thy name to the men whom thou gavest me out of the world. They were thine, thou gavest them to me, and they have kept thy word. Now they know that everything that thou hast given me is from thee, for I have given them the words which thou gavest me; and they have received them, and know in truth that I came from thee; and they have believed that thou didst send me. I am praying for them. I am not praying for the world but for those whom thou hast given me, for they are thine. And all mine are thine, and thine are mine, and I am glorified in them. And now I am no more in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to thee. Holy Father, keep them in thy name, which thou hast given me, that they may be one as we are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in thy name, which thou gavest me, I have guarded them, and none of them is lost but the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to thee, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. I have given them thy word; and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. I do not pray that thou shouldest take them out of the world, but that thou shouldest keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. Sanctify them in the truth. Thy word is truth. As thou hast sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

I do not pray for these only, but also for those who believe in me through their word; that they may all be one, even as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee; that they also may be one in us, so that the world may believe that thou hast sent me. The glory which thou hast given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one: I in them, and thou in me; that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast loved them even as thou hast loved me. Father, I desire that they also, whom thou hast given me, may be with me where I am, to behold my glory which thou hast given me; for thou loved me before the foundation of the world. O righteous Father! The world has not known thee, but I have known thee, and these know that thou hast sent me. I made known to them thy name, and I will make it known, that the love with which thou hast loved me may be in them, and I in them."

Second Gospel John 18:1-28

At that time, Jesus went forth with his disciples over the Kidron brook, where there was a garden, which he and his disciples entered. Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place; for Jesus often met there with his disciples. So Judas, procuring a band of soldiers and some officers from the chief priests and Pharisees, went there with lanterns, torches, and weapons. Then Jesus, knowing all that was to befall him, came forward and said to them, "Whom do you seek?" They answered him, "Jesus of Nazareth." Jesus said to them, "I am he." And Judas, who betrayed him, was standing with them. When Jesus said to them, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground. Again Jesus asked them, "Whom do you seek?" And they said, "Jesus of Nazareth." Jesus answered, "I told you that I am he; so, if you seek me, let these men go." This was to fulfil the word which he had spoken, "Of those whom thou gavest me I lost none." Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant, and cut off his right ear. The servant's name was Malchus. Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword into the sheath; Shall I not drink the cup which the Father has given me?"

So the band of soldiers and their captain and the officers of the Jews seized Jesus and bound him. First they led him to Annas, for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas who was high priest that year. It was Caiaphas who had given counsel to the Jews that it was expedient that one man should die for the people.

Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did another disciple. As this disciple was known to the high priest, he entered the court of the high priest along with Jesus, while Peter stood outside at the door. So the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, went out and spoke to the maid who kept the door, and brought Peter in. Then the maid who kept the door said to Peter, "Are you not also one of this Man's disciples?" Peter said, "I am not." Now the servants and officers had made a charcoal fire, for it was cold, and they were warming themselves. Peter also was with them standing and warming himself.

The high priest then questioned Jesus about his disciples and his doctrine. Jesus answered him, "I have spoken openly to the world. I have always taught in synagogue and in the temple, where all Jews come together; I have said nothing secretly. Why do you ask me? Ask those who have heard me what I said to them; they know what I said." When Jesus had said this, one of the officers standing by struck him with his hand, saying, "Is that how you answer the high priest?" Jesus answered him, "If I have spoken wrongly, bear witness to the wrong; but if have spoken rightly, why do you strike me?" Annas then sent him bound to Caiaphas the high priest.

Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. They said to him, "Are you not also one of his disciples?" He denied it and said, "I am not!" One of the servants of the high priest, a kinsman of the man whose ear Peter cut off, asked: "Did I not see you in the garden with him?" Peter again denied it; and at once the cock crowed.

Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas to the Praetorium. It was early. They themselves did not enter the Praetorium, so that they might not be defiled, but might eat the Pascha.

PEOPLE: Glory to thy long-suffering, O Lord, Glory to thee.

## Fourth Antiphon, Fifth Tone

PEOPLE: Today Judas rejects the Master and accepts the devil. Blinded by the passion of the love of money, he became darkened losing light. How could

he see, having sold the illuminating Star for thirty pieces of silver? But he who suffered for the world's sake has risen for us. To him let us cry: Glory to thee, for thou sufferest and sharest human sufferings.

Today Judas is disguised under godliness and thus alienates himself from the divine gift; though a disciple, he turns a traitor. Under a guise of fraternity he hides his guile. He foolishly prefers thirty pieces of silver to the Master's love, and becomes a guide to the law-transgressing council. But we have Christ as our salvation, let us glorify him.

As brethren in Christ, let us obtain brotherly love. Let us not be careless to our neighbor, so that we may not be condemned like the unmerciful servant for money's sake, or repent like Judas to no profit.

# Third Gospel Matthew 26:57-75

Now the chief priests and the whole council sought false testimony against Jesus that they might put him to death, but they found none, though many false witnesses came forward. At last two came forward and said, "This fellow said, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and to build it in three days." And the high priest stood up and said: "Have you no answer to make? What is it that these men testify against you?" But Jesus was silent. And the high priest said to him, "I adjure you by the living God: Tell us if you are the Christ, the Son of God!" Jesus said to him, "You have said so. But I tell you, hereafter you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of the Power and coming on the clouds of heaven." Then the high priest tore his robes and said, "He has uttered blasphemy! Why do we still need witnesses? You have now heard his blasphemy! What is your judgment?" They answered, "He deserves death." Then they spat in his face and struck him; and some slapped him saying, "Prophesy to us, you Christ! Who is it that struck you?"

Now Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard. And a maid came up to him and said, "You also were with Jesus the Galilean." But he denied it before them all saying, "I do not know what you mean." And when he went out to the porch, another maid saw him and said to the bystanders, "This man was with Jesus of Nazareth." And again Peter denied it with an oath, "I do not know the Man!" After a little while the bystanders came up and said to Peter, "Certainly, you also are one of them, for your accent betrays you." Then Peter began to invoke a curse on himself and swear, "I do not know the Man!" And immediately the cock crowed. And Peter remembered the saying of Jesus, "Before the cock crows, you will deny me three times." And Peter went out and wept bitterly.

PEOPLE: Glory to thy long-suffering, O Lord, Glory to thee.

# Seventh Antiphon, Eighth Tone

CHOIR: While enduring the transgressors of the law seizing thee, O Lord, thou didst cry aloud: Even if you strike the shepherd and scatter the twelve sheep, my disciples, yet I could bring into your presence more than twelve legions of angels. But I endure patiently, so that the secret and hidden things that I have manifested through my prophets may be fulfilled. O Lord, glory to thee.

Having denied thee three times, Peter comprehended thy words to him, so he offered to thee the tears of repentance. O Lord, have mercy on me and save me.

## Fourth Gospel John 18:28-40

At that time, they led Jesus from Caiaphas to the Praetorium. It was early. They themselves did not enter the Praetorium so that they might not be defiled, but might eat the Pascha. So Pilate went out to them and said, "What accusation do you bring against this Man?" They answered him, "If this man were not an evildoer, we would not have handed him over." Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and judge him by your own law." The Jews said to him, "It is not lawful for us to put any man to death." This was to fulfil the word which Jesus had spoken showing by what death he was to die. Pilate entered the Praetorium again and called Jesus and said to him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?" Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me; what have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would fight that I might not be handed over to the Jews; but my kingdom is not from the world." Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice." Pilate said to him, "What is truth?"

After Pilate had said this, he went out to the Jews again and told them, "I find no crime in him. But you have a custom that I should release one man for you at the Pascha. Will you have me release for you the King of the Jews?" They cried out again, "Not this Man, but Barabbas!" Now Barabbas was a robber.

#### John 19:1-16

Then Pilate took Jesus and scourged him. And the soldiers plaited a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they arrayed him in a purple robe; they came up to him saying, "Rejoice, King of the Jews!" And struck him with their hands. Pilate went out again and said to them, "See, I am bringing him out to you, that you may know that I find no crime in him." So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, "Behold the Man!" When the chief priests and officers saw him, they cried out, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourself and crucify him, for I find no crime in him." The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and by our law he ought to die because he made himself the Son of God." When Pilate heard these words, he was the more afraid. He entered the Praetorium again and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. Pilate therefore said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to crucify you, and power to release you?" Jesus answered him, "You would have no power over me unless it had been given to you from above. Therefore the one who delivered me to you has the greater sin."

Upon this Pilate sought to release him, but the Jews cried out, "If you release this Man, you are not Caesar's friend. Every one who makes himself a king speaks against Caesar." When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the judgment seat at a place called The Pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation of the Pascha, it was about the sixth hour. Pilate said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" They cried out, "Away with him, away with him! Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar!" Then he handed Jesus over to them to be crucified.

PEOPLE: Glory to thy long-suffering, O Lord, glory to thee.

# Tenth Antiphon, Sixth Tone

CHOIR: The One who is robed in light as with a garment<sup>53</sup> stood naked on trial; on his cheeks he received slaps from the hands which he created. The law-transgressing people crucified the Lord of Glory.<sup>54</sup> At that moment, the curtain of the temple was torn in two,<sup>55</sup> and the sun was darkened, for it could not bear to see being cursed the God before whom all the universe trembles. Let us fall down before him.

The disciple denied thee, and the thief cried aloud: Remember me, O Lord, in thy kingdom. 56

Neither the shaking of the earth, nor the splitting of the rocks, nor the tearing of the curtain of the temple, nor the raising of the dead persuaded the Jews. But render to them, O Lord, according to their works, for they plot in vain<sup>59</sup> against thee.

Today the curtain of the temple is torn as a reproach to the law breakers; the sun hides its own rays, seeing the Master crucified.

O lawgivers of Israel, Jews and Pharisees, the company of the apostles cries aloud to you: Behold the temple that you have destroyed, here is the Lamb you have crucified. You delivered him to the tomb, but by his own power he has risen. Do not stray away, O Jews, for it is he who rescued you from the sea and fed you in the wilderness. He is the life and light and peace of the world.

## Fifth Gospel Matthew 27:3-32

At that time, when Judas, his betrayer, saw that Jesus was condemned, he felt regret and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, saying, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood." They said, "What is that to us? See to it yourself!" And throwing down the pieces of silver in the temple he departed, and he went and hanged himself. But the chief priests taking the pieces of silver said, "It is not lawful to put them into the treasury, since they are blood money." So they took counsel and bought with them the potter's field, to bury strangers in. Therefore that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. Then was fulfilled what had been spoken by the prophet Jeremiah, saying, "And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of him who was valued by the sons of Israel, and they gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord directed me."

Now Jesus stood before the governor. And the governor asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus said, "You have said so." But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he made no answer. Then Pilate said to him, "Do you not hear how many things they testify against you?" But Jesus gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the governor wondered greatly.

Now at the feast the governor was accustomed to release for the crowd any one prisoner whom they wanted. And they had then a notorious prisoner called Barabbas. So when they had gathered, Pilate said to them, "Whom do you want me to release for you? Barabbas, or Jesus who is called Christ?" For he knew that it was out of envy that they had delivered him up. Besides, while he was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent word to him, "Have nothing to do with that righteous Man, for I have suffered much over him today in a dream." Now the chief priests and elders persuaded the people to ask for Barabbas and destroy Jesus. The governor again said to them, "Which of the two do you want me to release for you?" And they said, "Barabbas!" Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said, "Let him be crucified!" And Pilate said, "Why, what evil has he done?" But they shouted all the more, "Let him be crucified!"

When Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, but rather a riot was beginning, he took water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this righteous man's blood. See to it yourselves." And all the people answered, "His blood be on us and on our children." Then Pilate released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered him to be crucified.

Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the Praetorium, and they gathered the whole battalion before him. And they stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him. And plaiting a crown of thorns, they put it on his head and a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him they mocked him saying, "Rejoice, King of the Jews!" And they spat on him and took the reed and struck him on the head. And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the robe, put his own clothes on him, and led him away to crucify him.

As they went out, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name. This man they compelled to carry the cross of Jesus.

PEOPLE: Glory to thy long-suffering, O Lord, glory to thee.

## Thirteenth Antiphon, Sixth Tone

CHOIR:

O Lord, the assembly of the Jews asked Pilate to crucify thee. Though they could find no charge against thee, they set free the guilty Barabbas; and thee, the innocent One, they condemned. So they incurred the charge of blood-guiltiness. Render to them, O Lord, according to their works, for they plotted in vain against thee.

Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God,<sup>62</sup> before whom all things tremble and shake with fear, to whom every tongue sing praises, is slapped on the face by the priests and given gall to drink. Yet he willingly suffered all things, wishing to save us from our wickedness by his own blood, for he is the lover of mankind.

While Antiphon 15 is sung, the Procession of the Holy Crucifix takes place in the following manner:

- a. when the chanter completes, Antiphon 14, the Priest censes the Holy Crucifix (nine times).
- b. the Church is darkened and remains as dark as possible during the rest of the service.
- c. as the Priest begins to sing: "Today he is suspended on a tree" very slowly, he carries the Crucifix on his right shoulder around the Church as in the Great Entrance of the Divine Liturgy.
- d. the Procession is led by altar boys carrying the Processional cross, candles and incense.
- e. the people kneel during the Procession.
- f. when the Priest reaches the middle of the Solea, he carries the Holy Crucifix around the stand (three times.)
- g. the Priest then censes the Holy Crucifix (nine times).
- h. while the chanter sings: "Today he is suspended on a tree," the Priest makes three prostrations before the Holy Crucifix, kisses it, and returns to the Sanctuary with the Altar Boys.

### Fifteenth Antiphon

Today he who hung the earth on the waters is hung on the tree. (Three times)

The King of Angels is arrayed with a crown of thorns.<sup>63</sup>

## Sixth Gospel Mark 15:16-32

At that time, the soldiers led Jesus away inside the palace (that is, Praetorium); and they called together the whole battalion. And they clothed him in a purple cloak; and plaiting a crown of thorns, they put it on him. And they began to salute him, "Rejoice, King of the Jews!" And they struck his head with a reed and spat on him; and knelt down in homage to him. And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the purple cloak, and put his own clothes on him, and led him out to crucify him.

And they compelled a passer-by, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry the cross of Jesus. And they brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha, (which means the Place of a Skull). And they offered him wine mingled with myrrh, but he did not take it. And when they crucified him, they divided his garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. And it was the third hour when they crucified him. And the inscription of the charge against him read, "THE KING OF THE JEWS." And with him they also crucified two robbers, one on his right and one on his left. And the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "He was reckoned with the transgressors." And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads saying, "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself, and come down from the

cross!" So also the chief priests mocked him to one another with the scribes saying, "He saved others; he cannot save himself. Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross that we may see and believe."

CHOIR: In thy Kingdom, remember us, O Lord, when thou comest into thy Kingdom.

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.<sup>69</sup>

READER: Through a tree, Adam had to live far away from his home in Paradise, and through the tree of the cross the thief came to live in Paradise. For the one by eating transgressed the commandment of the Creator; but the other, who was crucified at thy side, confessed thee as the hidden God. Remember us also, O Savior, in thy Kingdom.

READER: The Law breakers took the Law maker from his disciples, and they made him stand as a Law breaker before the court of Pilate crying: Crucify him, crucify him who gave them manna in the wilderness. Following the example of the upright thief, we cry aloud in faith: Remember us, O Savior, in thy Kingdom.

CHOIR: Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.<sup>71</sup>

Then they sat down and kept watch over him there. And over his head they put a charge against him which read: THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE JEWS. Then two robbers were crucified with him, one on the right and one on the left. And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads and saying, "You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself! If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross." So also the chief priests, with the scribes and elders, mocked him, saying, "He saved others; he cannot save himself. If he is the King of Israel, let him come down now from the cross, and we will believe in him. He trusts in God; let God deliver him now if he desires him; for he said, 'I am the Son of God." And the robbers who were crucified with him also reviled him in the same way.

with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. He who saw it has borne witness--his testimony is true, and he knows that he tells the truth--that you also may believe. For these things took place that the Scripture might be fulfilled, "Not a bone of him shall be broken." And again another Scripture says, "They shall look on him whom they have pierced."

DEACON: Let us bow our heads unto the Lord.

The Prayer at the Bowing of Heads

## Eleventh Gospel

So he came and took away Jesus' body. Also Nicodemus, who had at first come to Jesus by night, came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pounds' weight. They took the body of Jesus, and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. Now in the place where he was crucified, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb where no one had ever been laid. So, because of the Jewish day of Preparation, as the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there.

### **Second Tone**

They divided my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots.<sup>94</sup>

Why do the ungodly and law-transgressing people plot in vain? Why have they condemned to death the life of all? O great wonder! The Creator of the world is delivered into the hands of the transgressors of the law, and the Lover of mankind is raised on the Cross, so that he may set free the prisoners in Hades, who cry: O long-suffering Lord, glory to thee.

PRIEST: For thou art a merciful God and lovest mankind, and unto thee we give glory, to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

PEOPLE: Amen.

#### The Dismissal

DEACON: Wisdom!

PEOPLE: Father, bless.

PRIEST: Blessed is HE WHO IS, Christ our God, always now and ever, and unto ages of ages.
